## *Strengthening the **Integrated Health System** to Improve Child Survival in Uganda*

---

- » **Lead entity:** Asociación CESAL
- » **Partner entities:** Meeting Point Kitgum (MPK), Gulu Regional Referral Hospital, Uganda Ministry of Health, AVSI Foundation
- » **Project duration:** 12 months
- » **Objective:** to implement strategies designed to strengthen the district health system in child survival through technical support, especially for health professionals.

## ***SafeStart:** Evaluation of interventions delivered through the Expanded Program on Immunization to Improve Child Survival in Sierra Leone*

- » **Lead entity:** Institut de Salut Global de Barcelona (ISGlobal)
- » **Partner entities:** National Child Health Programme, Ministry of Health / World Health Organization, Sierra Leone / College of Medicine & Allied Health Sciences, University of Sierra Leone (COMAHS, USL)
- » **Project duration:** 18 months
- » **Objective:** to evaluate the interventions delivered through the Expanded Programme on Immunisation to prevent malaria in children and train health professionals to update their knowledge and skills following identified training needs.

*Improving maternal and neonatal care for vulnerable populations in rapidly urbanizing Dar es Salaam, Tanzania*

- » **Lead entity:** Comprehensive Community Based Rehabilitation in Tanzania (CCBRT)
- » **Partner entity:** National Institute of Medical Research (NIMR)
- » **Project duration:** 24 months
- » **Objective:** to improve maternal and newborn health by ensuring quality care in emergency obstetric and newborn care facilities, with equitable access to advanced surgical care.

*Reducing maternal and infant mortality in commune VI of Bamako and in the Sikasso region, Mali*

- » **Partner entities:** Conseils et Appui pour l’Education à la Base (CAEB) / Muso, Inc.
- » **Project duration:** 24 months
- » **Objective:** reduce maternal and infant mortality by improving infrastructure and equipment, capacity building of health workers at the community level and advocacy for public policies.
